THEME OF THE DAY

Today we begin a new sermon series on the Old Testament prophet Micah—*Fierce Judgment: Final Grace*. In this service we learn that God arrives to address our deep pain of loneliness.

OLD TESTAMENT READING

Micah 1:1–4

¹The word of the LORD that came to Micah of Moresheth in the days of Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah, kings of Judah, which he saw concerning Samaria and Jerusalem.

²Hear, you peoples, all of you;
pay attention, O earth, and all that is in it,
and let the Lord God be a witness against you,
the Lord from his holy temple.

³For behold, the LORD is coming out of his place,
and will come down and tread upon the high places of the earth.

⁴And the mountains will melt under him,
and the valleys will split open,


